

RIGEL-TU PROGRESS REPORT

The Second City-Wide STAR TREK Meeting: Rigel-Tu is scheduled for Saturday, August 24, 1974, in the auditorium at the Bennett Martin Library at 14th & "N" streets. There will be no admission fees charged to attend Rigel-Tu. The Meeting will last from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m..

Rigel-Tu is being co-sponsored by the City-Wide STAR TREK Club: Star Base Andromeda, the Quei-Starmerian Network, and the Lincoln, Nebraska branch of STAR TREK Fans United. The Rigel-Tu committee is co-chaired by John Luke and Richard Heim, and consists (as of August 4) of the following seven SBA members: Richard Heim, Peter Jorgensen, John Luke, Nancy Munden, Mark Renken, David Robinson, and Bob Wilcox.

The primary purpose of Rigel-Tu is to serve as a regional gettogether of STAR TREK fans. Rigel-Tu will be a kind of mini-festival, at which STAR TREK fans in Lincoln and the Midwest can meet and exchange greetings and share their thoughts and ideas about their favorite science-fiction television series, as well as be entertained by the schedule of activities being planned. Rigel-Tu could very well serve as the motivational force behind the organization of STAR TREK fandom in the Midwest.

Among the activities scheduled thus far: an Audio-Visual Slide Show presentation of "The Cage"; at least one Slide Show wherein people in the audience try to guess which episode the various slides are from; a panel discussion of the clubs and activities which compose STAR TREK's fandom; Sales Tables, at which fanzines, posters, and other fan-related material will be sold, including orders for slide duplications and photographs from slides; a Display Table; two contests; and other special activities. Refreshments will be sold, and two petitions will be circulated which people can sign asking KETV and KOLN-TV to bring STAR TREK reruns to the area. A Special STAR TREK Survey questionaire will be distributed to attendees of the Meeting.

The science film, "In Search Of Ancient Astronauts", and the science fiction movie, "The Forbidden Planet", will be shown at Rigel-Tu.

Unfortunately, there will NOT be any live-action or animated

STAR TREK episodes.

There will be an SBA membership drive during Rigel-Tu (exactly 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. on August 24, 1974). Memberships will be sold for the special price of \$2.50 per member per year, instead of the nor-

mal \$4.00 per year per member price.

Instructions for entering the two contests (STAR TREK Homemade Creations Contest and STAR TREK Photograph Caption Contest) are enclosed with this newsletter. Of special importance: Homemade Greations Contest entries should be submitted to Mark Renken at 1610 N. 61st Street no later than August 21.
